Fall 113 lks. N. of the Std. cor. of secs. 31 and 32. 80.00 The course and length of the first half mile is S.89° 08'E., 40.33 chs.; the second half mile is S.89°15'E., 39.67 chs.

East, on retracement, along the S. bdy. of Sec. 32, 40.00 Fall 58 lks. N. of the Std. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, Fall 88 lks. N. of the Std. cor. of secs. 32 and 33. The course and length of the first half mile is S.89° 10'E., 40.00 chs.; the second half mile is S.89°34'E., 40.00 chs.

> East, on retracement, along the S. bdy. of T.26N., R.48E. Intersect the E. bdy. of T. 26 N., R. 48 E., N.0°07'E., 5.37 chs. from the old Std. cor. of T. 26 N., R. 48 E. which is a juniper stake, 4 ins. square, 4 ft. long, plainly scribed and lying on a distinct mound of earth and stone. I destroy this corner. The old cor. of secs. 25 and 36, T. 26 N., R. 48 E., which is a fragment of juniper stake, 2 ins. square,

16 ins. long, lying on a distinct mound of earth and stone, one face of stake being plainly scribed, bears North 74.78 chs. distant. I subsequently restore this corner.
