General Description.

Most of this township lies on a low rolling flat, the general drainage and slope being west and south-west toward the dry lake bed situated in the western portion of the township. This lake bed averages about two miles in width and about four and one-half miles in length within the township and extends several miles in a general south-westerly direction beyond the south boundary. A narrow, broken strip of rolling clay hills borders the lake bed on the east shore line. These hillocks vary in height from 3 to 20 ft. and are covered with a scant growth of greasewood. In the spring and early summer months, the lake bed is covered with water three to twenty inches in depth holding the fine clay or silt-like deposits in suspension. The water is unsuited for stock-watering purposes.
