General Description.

The northern portion of this township lies on a gentle rolling plain cut by numerous small draws draining in a general northerly direction. The balance of the township is mountainous and hilly and none of the land is suited to agricultural pursuits other than stock-grazing. The main ridge or divide cuts thru the township in the southwest corner extending in a general northwesterly and southerly direction. Two prominent peaks, known as Twin Peaks, are located on this divide in the northeast part of section 30.

High bench or mesa lands in the eastern portion afford splendid grazing in the spring and early summer months. The higher mountainous slopes are covered with a dense growth of scrubby juniper, pinon pine and mahogany timber. Its only value is for fuel and a limited number of fence posts.

A large spring with watering-troughs is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 28. A spring and reservoir supplying water for limited irrigation purposes on Maurice Isaac's ranch in fractional T. 25 N., R. 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 31.
