General Description of T. 25 N., R. 54 E.

The land embraced in this township varies from a rough mountainous in the eastern portion to a barren, level flat in the western portion. The Diamond range of mountains- the tops of which are about 8500 feet above sea level - traverses the township from south to north thru the east range of sections, and the steep rocky slopes are covered with a scattering to medium dense growth of scrub timber and undergrowth. The general drainage is westerly. The extreme western part lies on the barren flat of an old dry lake bed. The soil, both on the lake bed and on the gentle west slope on the east side of the lake, is a fine sandy to gravelly alkaline clay loam, from 6 to 30 ins. or more in depth but owing to its great alkali content very little vegetation is to be found. The undergrowth is a stunted sagebrush and rabbit brush. The timber in the township - found on the high rocky slopes - is very small and scrubby and is of no commercial value other than for fuel and for a limited supply of juniper fence posts.
