Deposit a brown basalt rock, 6x6x12 ins., mkd. a cross (x) on top surface, at base of mound and alongside post.

Land, mountainous. NE. and S. exposure, general drainage E.

Soil, shallow rocky basaltic loam, coarse texture, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, yellow top, service berry.

Timber, a few scattering aspen along creek.

Good grazing.

SURVEY OF THE WEST BDY. OF T. 29 N., R. 54 E.

From the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, previously

described, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., South, on true line, bet. secs. 13 and 18, Over hilly and mountainous land thru dense undergrowth.

Asc. gradual NE. slope.

.45 Old road, bears NW ^{to Bullion} and SE.

1.00 Old road, bears E. and W.

19.40 Spur, 280 ft. above sec. cor., projects N.80°E., continue along steep E. slope.

25.30 Shallow draw, drains E., asc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.

28.90 Spur, projects E., desc. along steep E. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and 24 ins. in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 18, with brass cap mkd:
