

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SIXTH STANDARD PARALLEL NORTH
THRU R. 59 E.

Chains

- 24.10 Telephone line, bears N.20°E. and S.20°W.
- 28.70 Wire fence, bears N.21°E. and S.21°W.
- 29.20 Road, bears N.21°E. to Elko, Nevada and S.21°W. to
Ruby Valley Post-office.
- 29.80 Wire fence, bears N.21°E. and S.21°W., continue over
sagebrush land, slight SE. slope and drainage.
- 31.00 Small stream, 7 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, course SE.
- 40.19 The Std. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, hereinbefore described.
Thence
N.89°35'W., on true line, the Std. cor. of secs. 31 and 32
32 being in sight,
Asc. gradual E. slope thru scattering sagebrush.
- 13.50 Small creek, 4 lks. wide, 10 ins. deep, course S.15°E.
- 39.89 The Std. cor. of secs. 31 and 32 which is a grey granite
stone, 16x4x10 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked
"SC" on N. face but no marks discernible on E. or W.
faces. Alongside,
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in
the ground, for the restored Std. cor. of secs. 31
and 32, with brass cap mkd:

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, N.
of cor.

Land, nearly level and slight rolling. Eastern exposure
and drainage.

Soil, sandy alluvial loam to shallow gravelly loam;

on surface.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, willow.

Timber, a few scattering cottonwoods along streams.

Good grazing.
