Chains

- 38.45 Old road, bears S.80°W. and N.80°E.
- 40.12 Wire fence, bears N. and S.
- 40.17 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, hereinbefore described.

West, on true line, with continuous measurement,
- 42.10 Creek, 12 lks. wide, 10 ins. deep, course NE. 1 ch.
thence Easterly. Asc. E. slope thru dense undergrowth.
- 62.20 Low spur, 120 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., projects S., desc.
along S. slope.
- 68.10 Old wood road, bears NW. and SE., asc. 50 ft. over E.

thickets of dense willow.
- .20 Wire fence, bears S.80°E., and N.80°W., continue over
meadow land.
- 38.40 Wire fence, bears S.87°E. and N87°W.
- 39.88 Fence corner, from which fences bears N.10°E., and
S.24 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W.
- 39.90 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 32 and 33, previously described
