Chains	<p>above ground, mkd: x B0 S7, bears S.53°E., 93 lks. distant.</p> <p>A cross (x) on top of granite boulder showing 40x40x8 ins. above ground, mkd: X B0, bears S.63$\frac{1}{2}$°W., 33 lks. distant.</p> <p>Land, rough mountainous. General E. exposure and drainage.</p> <p>Soil, shallow stony and rocky loam, coarse texture, granite formation, 3rd and 4th rate.</p> <p>Undergrowth, laurel, buck brush, willows, mountain ash, sagebrush,</p> <p>Timber, pinon pine, scrub aspen and mahogany.</p> <p>Excellent grazing and browsing on SW. and NE. slopes.</p> <p>-----</p> <p>It being impossible to project a line North from the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, above described, owing to impassible cliffs, I offset as follows:</p> <p>N.89°52'E., 7.21 chs.; descending over precipitous E. slope, 300 ft. thru scattering timber and undergrowth. Raise a small mound of stone for temp. witness point. Thence,</p> <p>North, on offset line, in sec. 6,</p> <p>Over rough mountainous land thru scattering timber and undergrowth. Asc. 110 ft. over rocky SE. slope.</p> <p>4.50 Rocky spur, projects S.60°E., desc. rocky NE. slope.</p> <p>9.40 Creek, 20 ft. below spur, 2 lks. wide, 3 ins. deep, course S.60°E., asc. 360 ft. over rocky S. slope.</p> <p>19.10 Base of prominent blue granite cliff, approximately 100 ft. high, bears West 30 lks. distant from which a rocky spur projects E. Base of cliff bears W. of N. and SW., desc. over rocky NE. slope thru scattering scrub pinon pine.</p> <p>40.00 On E. slope, 250 ft. below spur, set a temp. witness point from which I run,</p> <p>S.89°52'W., 7.21 chs.; ascending 280 ft. over rocky E.</p>
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
