

## SURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE N. BDY. OF T. 31 N., R. 59 E.

Chains	Desc. along gradual NE. slope.
71.10	Slope changes to abrupt, rocky NE. 200 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., desc. 70 ft. to creek.
76.40	Creek, 8 lks. wide, 12 ins. deep, course S.85°E., asc. over rocky S. slope.
80.94	The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, hereinbefore described. Land, broken and hilly. General NE. exposure and drainage. Numerous small surface boulders. Soil, shallow gravelly and rocky loam, coarse texture, rocky subsoil, 3rd rate. Undergrowth, sagebrush, willows, laurel and service berry. Timber, aspen, cottonwoods and choke cherry along creek bottoms; scattering mahogany on slopes. Good grazing.
