The southwest portion of this township is rough mountainous land, covered with a dense growth of pinon pine, cedar, mahogany and fir timber. The soil is sandy and gravelly, covered with a scant growth of sage and shadscale. The remaining portion of the township, except the bottom land along Weaver and Silver creeks, is rolling land, a portion of which is covered with scattering pinon pine and cedar timber. The soil is a sandy, gravelly and rocky loam, covered with a medium growth of shadscale. The soil along the creek bottoms is a light sandy loam, covered with a good growth of bunch grass, shadscale and sage.

There were two settlers residing within the township at the time of survey.

There are surface indications of gold and silver in secs. 8 and 9.

Weaver Cr. enters the township in sec. 7 and flows in an easterly direction through secs. 7, 8 and 9, and the extreme S.W. portion of sec. 10.

Silver Greek flows through the N.E. portion of sec. 1.

There is running water in Mill Greek through sections
31 and 32.

Strawberry Cr. enters Tp. in Sec. 30, flows N.E. thru Secs. 30, 29 and 20.

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
