	Timber, pinon pine, juniper, scrubby aspen. Excellent grazing.

	East, on true line, bet. secs. 1 and 36, Over rough mountainous land thru scattering clumps of aspen and thru very dense sagebrush undergrowth. Asc. rocky SW. slope.
14.10	Main ridge of White Rock Mountain and divide between Hamlin Valley on the East and Spring Valley on the West, bears NW. to a prominent rocky crest and SE. Desc. over broken and rocky NE. slope thru scattering undergrowth.
32.30	Enter clump of heavy balsam fir and aspen timber, bears N. and S., desc. abrupt E. slope.
35.00	Head of shallow draw, 180 ft. below ridge, drains N. Asc. gradual W. slope.
36.50	Leave heavy timber, bears N. and S. Continue over W. slope with numerous rock outcrops.
40.00	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock and 12 ins. in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked S 36 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 1923 Excellent grazing.

	A balsam fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.5°E., 539 lks. distant, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S36 BT This is a lone tree at southwest end of rocky outcrop.
	A balsam fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.82 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 405 lks. distant, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S1 BT
	Continue ascent of gentle, rocky W. slope.
47.50	Slope changes to a gentle SE.
57.50	Slope changes to an abrupt and rocky NE., desc. 200 ft.
64.30	Head of small draw, drains NE., enter very heavy timber and dense tangled undergrowth Continue slight descent along steep, rocky NE. slope.
