

Dependent Resurvey of the West Boundary of T. 5 S., R. 71 E.

Chains

Soil, rocky and sandy loam.

Timber, cedar and pinon.

Undergrowth, sagebrush.

Fair grazing.

 N.0°11'W., on true line on east bdy. sec. 1.

Desc. NW. slope, over mountainous land, covered with medium growth of cedar and pinon timber, and medium growth of sagebrush undergrowth.

0.53 Set iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs. 6 and 7, with brass cap marked

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N.54°E., 38 lks. dist., mkd. T 5 S R 71 E S 6 B T.

A cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears S.86½°E., 53 lks. dist., mkd. T 5 S R 71 E S 7 B T.

3.50 Spur, projects NW.; continue descent.

10.00 Draw, 120 ft. below spur, drains NE.; continue descent.

15.40 Telephone line; St. George, Utah to Acoma, Nevada, bears E. and W.

20.00 Draw, 55 ft. below draw, drains NE.; continue descent.

39.90 The ¼ sec. cor. for secs. 1 and 6, which is a granite stone, 8 x 10 x 14 ins. above ground, set in mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I destroy the bearing tree pertaining to sec. 6, and re-establish this cor as follows:
 Set iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the ¼ sec. cor., for sec. 1 only, with brass cap marked
