40.30 Draw, drains SW., asc. NW. slope thru heavy timber.

47.80 Spur, 150 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., projects S.30°W., desc.
SE. slope.

48.50 Head of draw drains S.30°W., asc. along NW. slope.

49.80 Spurs project S.30°W. and S., desc. SE. slope.

57.30 Draw, 90 ft. below spur, drains S.60°E. from N. Draw
from S.60°E. enters main draw at this point. Asc.
broken gentle SW. slope.66.60 Flat top of rocky spur, 50 ft. above draw, projects SW.
