

## East Boundary of T. 10 N., R. 51 E.

Chains

North, on true line, bet. secs. 7 and 12,

Over rolling and broken hilly land thru medium heavy timber and medium dense undergrowth. Along broken W. slope.

3.70 Spur, projects W., desc. broken NW. slope.

10.10 Draw, 40 ft. below spur, drains N.60°W. from East. Asc. gentle S. slope.

10.30 Intersect the Second Standard Parallel North, West 18.33 chs. distant from the Std. cor. of secs. 31 and 32, T. 11 N., R. 52 E. hereinbefore described.

At point of intersection,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the closing cor. of T. 10 N., Rs. 51 and 52 E., with brass cap marked

Soil, shallow gravelly and rocky clay loam, medium to coarse texture, rocky subsoil, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush.

Timber, juniper and pinon pine.

Good grazing.
