A pinon pine, 6 ins. diam., bears N.39°E., 28 lks.

distant, marked T10N R51E S18 BT

A pinon pine, 10 ins. diam., bears S.79½°E., 26 lks.

distant, marked T10N R51E S19 BT

A pinon pine, 14 ins. diam., bears S.51½°W., 49 lks.

distant, marked T10N R50E S24 BT

A pinon pine, 6 ins. diam., bears N.60½°W., 35 lks.

distant marked, T10N R50E S13 BT

Land, rough and broken mountainous.

Soil, shallow rocky clay loam, coarse texture, rock sub-soil, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, buck brush, service berry, sagebrush, deer brush.

Timber, pinon pine, juniper, mahogany.

Excellent grazing.

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North, bet. secs. 13 and 18,

Over rough and broken mountainous land thru heavy timber and medium dense undergrowth. Desc. rocky NE. slope.

8.00 Draw, 40 ft. below sec. cor., drains NE., continue along E. slope.

10.00 Spur projects N.60°E.

17.50 Spur projects NE., desc. along NW. slope.

20.40 Draw, 30 ft. below spur, drains N.15°E. from SW., desc. along broken E. slope.

39.30 Draw, 160 ft. below draw, drains NE., asc. abrupt rocky SE. slope over barren rock.

40.00 Point for ¼ sec. cor. falls on exposed limestone outcrop or surface rock sloping SE. At exact corner point, cut a 4 inch cross (x) and a (¼) over which I erect a low but substantial mound of stone 3 ft. base.
