

Subdivision of T. 10 N., R. 51 E.

Chains

10.32 Intersect the Second Standard Parallel North, West 18.32 chs. distant from the Std. cor. of Tps. 11 N., Rs. 51 and 52 E., hereinbefore described.

At point of intersection, on rolling SW. slope, Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for the closing corner of secs. 11 and 12, with brass cap marked

from which,

A juniper, 10 ins. diam., bears S.82°45'E., 430

lks. distant, marked T10N R51E S12 CC BT

A juniper, 4 ins. diam., bears S.36½°W., 135 lks.

distant, marked CC BT only.

Land, rolling; gentle S. and SW. slopes.

Soil, gravelly and rocky clay loam, rocky subsoil, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, yellow top, greasewood, buck brush shadscale.

Timber, very scattering juniper.

Fair grazing.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35; on the S. bdy. of Tp. hereinbefore described,

N. 0°01' W., on true line, bet. secs. 34 and 35,

Over very broken hilly land thru heavy timber and medium dense undergrowth. Desc. gradual N. slope.

1.00 Small draw drains E. from S.60°W.; asc. gravelly S. slope.

4.50 Small spur projects E., desc. N. slope.

7.90 Small draw drains S. of E., asc. S. slope.

9.50 Main spur projects N. of E.; continue across broad flat top of spur thru very dense undergrowth.

12.70 Small spur projects N.60°E.; desc. N. slope.
