GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The Second Standard Parallel North thru Ranges 50 and 51 East crosses the main divide of the Hot Creek Mountains. The western end of the Standard ascends over broken and rolling slopes to the main divide which is crossed on the S. bdy. of sec. 35 in R. 50 E. From here, the Standard continues over high broken slopes for two miles and then descends over rolling land to the Std. cor. of secs. 35 and 36 in R. 51 E. The south bdy. of sec. 31, R. 52 E. is along a broken ascent to a high ridge about three miles east.

There is generally good grazing along the Standard thru the high mountainous slopes but along the lower portions, grazing possibilities are very poor. No water or springs were noted near the Standard. The higher slopes are heavily timbered with junipers and pinon pines with many scattering clumps of very thick mahogany.

The lands in T. 10 N., R. 51 E. are rough and broken mountainous in the western portion with many high parallel spurs or ridges extending in a general easterly direction to the main draw in the extreme eastern part. The southeastern portion is broken and rough hilly with a general southwestern drainage while the northeastern portion is broken rolling land with a general southeasterly drainage.
