through Ranges 52 and 51 East

Chains Independent Resurvey of the Third Standard Parallel North  
through Ranges 52 and 51 East, Mount Diablo Meridian,  
superseding the survey made by E. B. Monroe, U. S. De-  
puty Surveyor in 1884. All distances double chained.  
Beginning at the standard corner of T 16 N, Rs 52 and 53,  
E. which is a hewn juniper post, 3 ft. long and 3 ins. sq.  
set in a mound of stone, the only discernable marks  
being 'R53ES31' on the east face, and which I remonu-  
ment as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 3 ins. in dia., 28 ins.  
in the ground, with a brass cap marked:

Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base and 1½ ft. high  
N of the post. No trees available for marking.

Thence West on the south boundary of sec. 36,  
Over low rolling hills. through scattering timber and  
scant undergrowth; asc. 90 ft. along a general SE  
slope to

40.00 On a SE slope,  
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 1 in. in dia., 27 ins.  
in the ground for the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36,  
with a brass cap marked:

Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base and 1½ ft. high  
N of the post. No trees available for marking. No  
trace of the old standard corner was found.

Asc. 40 ft. along a general SE slope over rolling land  
to the cor.

- 61.70 Dry, wash, drains NE.
- 70.00 Low spur, projects NE.
