Deposit a lava rock, 4 x 3 x 2 ins., marked with a cross (X) at base of post. No other suitable accessories available.

From the established cor. of Ts. 41 and 42 N., R. 23 E.; thence

N. $1^{\circ} 07' E.$, on true line along E. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over rolling land, through dense undergrowth.

22.00 Dry wash, course SW.; ascend gradually.

36.60 Low spur, 30 ft. above wash, projects W.; from NE.;

thence over rolling W. slope.

38.19 Southing of 40.00 chs. from cor. of secs. 25 and 36,

T. 42 N., R. 23 E., and cor. of Ts. 41 and 42 N., R. 24 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in

the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., sec. 36 only, with brass cap marked
