RANDOM LINES.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on N. bdy. of
T. 42 N., R. 23 E., hereinafter described; thence
East, on retracement line along N. bdy. of Tp., making
careful search for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. and sec. cors.
40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. No evidence of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. found.
80.00 Set temp. sec. cor. No evidence of old sec. cor. found.
120.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. No evidence of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. found.
147.31 Fall 5.06 chs. S. of the cor. of Ts. 42 and 43 N., R.

23 E., hereinafter described.

The course of the line from the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34
and 35 to the cor. of Ts. 42 and 43 N., R. 23 E.,
therefore is N. $88^{\circ}02'E.$, and the distance is 147.40
chains.

TRUE LINES.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on N. bdy. of
T. 42 N., R. 23 E., which is a lava rock, 20 x 16 x
6 ins., marked 6 grooves on N., and 2 grooves on E.
face, and loosely set in old mound of stone. Along-
side of this cor. monument.
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in
the ground for cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, with
brass cap marked.
