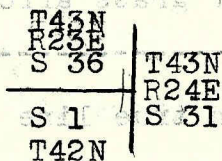


DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF NORTH BOUNDARY, T. 42 N., R. 23 E.

Chains

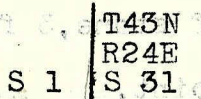
the ground for cor. of Ts. 42 and 43 N., R. 23 E.,

From this cor. the cor. of T. 43 N., Rs. 23 and 24 E.,
reestablished by W.E. Hoffman, U.S. surveyor, in 1915,
which is an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., set,
marked and witnessed as described in the official
returns of T. 42 N., R. 24 E., brs. S., 11.16 chs.
dist. I remark this cor. for the SW. cor. of T. 43 N.,
R. 24 E., as follows:-
