N. 0° 16'E., on true line bet. secs. 13 and 18.

Over rolling land, through medium undergrowth.


22.40 Road, brs. S. 70°E., and N. 70°W.

40.10 The original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is an igneous rock,

Alongside of cor. monument.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in
the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked



Deposit broken glass at base of post.
