

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The greater portion of the lands covered by this survey are rough mountainous in character, many of the slopes being precipitous and impassable. All of sections 16, 17, 20, 29 and 32 are level to gently rolling. The land in $W\frac{1}{2}$ of section 33 and $E\frac{1}{2}$ of section 32, settled by Wm. Pearce, is the only cultivated area in this fractional township. He has a large productive orchard and garden, and alfalfa fields with a total area of about 65 acres, all of which is subject to irrigation. The uplands are suitable only for grazing, there being no timber of commercial value.

The soil in the lowlands is generally a gravelly coarse sandy loam, while that of the highlands is rocky. No mineral deposits in paying quantities are found within the township.

The general drainage of the township is westerly. Sufficient water for all purposes is obtained from Bushee Creek and numerous springs in easterly portion of the township.

Winnemucca, Nevada, the county seat of Humboldt County and a station on the Southern Pacific Railway is located about 45 miles in a northerly direction.
