

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONS OF
T. 31 N., R. 41 E.

Chains

- Asc. broken E. slope.
- 62.60 Flat top of rocky spur or mesa, 290 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., bears N. and S., spur projects SE.
- 67.80 Desc. 80 ft. over abrupt rocky SW. slope.
- 71.80 Slope changes to a rocky SE., asc. 40 ft.
- 76.70 Rocky spur, projects S., desc. 60 ft. over SW. slope.
- 79.54 The cor. of secs. 5 and 6 previously described, from which Adobe house (largest and central one of group of five) bears S. $42^{\circ}20'W$.
- Tunnel portal on SE. slope bears N. $61\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$.
- Main shaft and derrick on SE. slope bears N. $59\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$.
- Tunnel portal on S. side of canyon bears S. $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$.
- Land, rolling and broken East half mile; choppy and hilly mountainous on west half mile. There are numerous outcrops on the west half mile.
- Soil, very shallow rocky loam, rock subsoil, 3rd and 4th rate.
- Undergrowth, sagebrush, shadscale, buck brush.
- No timber. Fair grazing.

SURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 31 N., R. 41 E.

- From the cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, properly marked and witnessed by a mound of stone to the west,
- South, on true line, bet. secs. 16 and 17,
- Over gentle rolling land thru medium heavy small undergrowth. Desc. gentle rolling SE. slope.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock and over a broken glass
