

Survey of a portion of the S. Bdy. of T. 30 N., R. 58 E.

Chains. from which

A limber pine 28 ins. in diam., bears N. $23\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 88 lks. distant, marked T30N R58E S32 BT

A limber pine 16 ins. in diam., bears N. 36° W., 203 lks. distant, marked T30N R58E S31 BT

Land, rough mountainous.

Soil, very shallow rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, sage, buckbrush and mountain laurel.

Timber, limber pine, mahogany and aspen.

West, on a true line, on the S. Bdy. of sec. 31.

Asc. very rocky NE. slope, thru scattering limber pines.

3.00 Small stream of water under slide of large granite boulders, course NE., continue ascent of very rough NE. slope.

28.30 Ascent becomes very abrupt over precipitous E. slope.

40.00 Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falls on steep barren granite ledge where it is impossible to establish corner.

41.40 At top of precipitous E. slope 1240 ft. above sec. cor., Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to solid bedrock and 20 ins. in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, for the witness $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked:

No suitable bearing trees available. Deposit a granite rock, 6x6x4 ins. marked cross (x) at base of mound.

41.80 Top of main divide -Ruby Mountains- bears N. 20° E. and South. Prominent rocky pinnacle on ridge bears S. $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. about 15 chs. distant. Descend abrupt W. slope over bare granite rocks.

55.00 Base of precipitous descent, 580 ft. below top of ridge; continue over broken, rocky W. slope.

70.00 Slope changes to a gradual NE. Small basin heads 10 chs. N. also a small basin about 10 chs. S.
