With the exception of portions of sections 24, 25 and 35, the township is very rough and mountainous. It lies on the east slope of the Ruby Mountain range from which rocky spurs project in a general southeasterly direction. The township is well watered; nearly every draw having a stream running from the high crest of the main divide. In normal years, snow banks remain thruout the summer on the high north slopes. The higher slopes are very rough and rocky; the soil is shallow but of good fertility. Except on the barren rocky slopes, dense undergrowth and scattering clumps of dense aspen timber are found thruout the township; limber pines and balsam fir are encountered on the slopes approaching the main divide. The timber has no commercial value other than for use as fuel. The lower slopes afford good grazing during the entire summer.

The unsurveyed portion of the township lies on the west slope of the main divide. A main ridge bears north and northwestward from the main divide in the central
