

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE N. BDY. OF T. 28 N., R. 59 E.

## Chains

The original corner of Ts. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., described as being a post,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ft. long, 4 ins. square, set 12 ins. in the ground, was not found but a distinct mound of earth and stones with the appearance of great age and traces of three shallow pits or depressions mark what is undoubtedly the old corner point. In the center of this mound, I set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock and 14 ins. in a mound of stone, for the reestablished cor. of Ts. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., with brass cap marked

No bearing trees being available, raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 3 ft. high, S. of cor.

To verify the position of this corner, I retraced East to the old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, which is a limestone rock, 10x14x18 ins., marked 5 grooves on E. face, 1 groove on W. face, firmly set in a substantial mound of stone. I find the course and distance to be in substantial agreement with the record.

From the Tp. cor. above described,

West, on retracement line, bet. secs. 1 and 36.

40.65 Fall 59 lks. S. of the point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36.

From the above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. point,

West, on retracement line, bet. secs. 1 and 36.

40.00 No trace of the orig. sec. cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36. West, on retracement line, bet. secs. 2 and 35, with continuous measurement from the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

120.87 Fall 105 lks. S. of the original cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35.

The course and distance of the east half mile bet. secs. 1 and 36 is N.89°10'W., 40.65 chs; the proportionate length of the west half mile is 40.29 chs. and the course is N.89°30'W. The course of the mile bet. secs. 2 and 35 is N.89°30'W., and the proportionate length of each half mile is 40.29 Chs.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35,

West; on retracement line, along the N. bdy. of secs.

3, 4, 5 and 6, searching for original corners at intervals of 40.00 chs. and at a record distance of 69.25 chs. on the N. bdy. of sec. 6 where the old meander cor.
