

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE EAST BDY. OF
T. 28 N., R. 58 E.

Chains

The original corner of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, T. 28 N.,
Rs. 58 and 59 E., is an old juniper post, 4 ft. long,
3 ins. square, surfaced on four sides and distinctly
scribed, lying on small but unmistakable mound of earth
with shallow pits in each section. In center of mound
set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 26 ins., in
the ground, with brass cap marked

- Renew pits, 18x18x12 ins., in each sec., 3 ft. dist.
North, on retracement line, bet. secs. 13 and 18,
40.00 Fall 42 lks. W. of the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.00 Fall 104 lks. W. of the original cor. of secs. 12, 13,
7 and 18.

The true course and distance of the S. half mile is
N. 0°36'E., 40.00 chs.; the N. half mile is N. 0°53'E.,
40.01 chs.

- North, on retracement line, bet. secs. 7 and 12,
40.24 Fall 17 lks. E. of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
72.00 Search for but find no trace of the original meander
corner of secs. 7 and 12.
The old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. was destroyed at the time this
line was ~~later~~ independently resurveyed.

- From the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, previously
described;
N. 0°36'E., on true line, bet. secs. 13 and 18,
Over nearly level land thru very dense undergrowth.
40.00 The original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 18, which is an
old juniper stake, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., surfaced
on two sides on one of which distinct scribe marks
show, lying on small mound of earth. In center of mound
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in
the ground, with brass cap marked

- Dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., N. and S. of post, 3 ft. dist.

N. 0°53'E., with continuous measurement, thru very dense
undergrowth over nearly level land.
