78.95 The original cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18 which is an
old jaspenn stake, 3 ft. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. square, scribed
on four faces, lying on distinct mound of earth. In
center of mound I find decayed stub of stake and set
an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the
ground with old corner stake alongside, for the re-
established cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18, with brass
cap marked
