Chains

Dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., on line, 3 ft. dist.

Land, level marsh and bottom land.

Soil, black clay loam, 3rd rate.

Vegetation, reeds and tules. Weeds.

Poor grazing.

From the cor. of Ts. 29 and 30 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E.,
hereinbefore described,

West, on true line, bet. secs. 1 and 36,

Over slightly broken land thru medium dense undergrowth.

The original cor., an aspen stake, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 2 ins.

square, scribed and surfaced on four faces, lying

on a small distinct mound of earth, bears N.38 $\frac{1}{4}$ °W.,

1.77 chs. distant. I destroy all trace of this corner

after using its position for a proportionate re-

storatation of corners to the south.

Land, nearly level; slightly broken and gently rolling.

Soil, sandy and alkaline clay loam, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, greasewood, rabbit brush.

Poor grazing.
