Undergrowth, sagebrush, buckbrush, laurel and a fine growth of nutritious grasses. Timber, pinon pine, mahogany and cedar.

General Description of T. 23 N., R. 65 E.

The character of the land in this township varies from nearly level along the E. bdy., at an elevation of about 5700 ft., to rough rugged mountainous along the entire W. Bdy.; which at its highest points reach an elevation of about 8000 ft. above sea level.

The whole of the east half of the township can be classed as heavy rolling and broken land 3rd rate. The 4th range of sections is generally heavy broken rolling mountainous, while the remainder is rough rugged mountainous.

Nearly all the drainage is eastward. The principal water course is a narrow rugged ravine, locally called Spring
