

Survey of the subdivisions of T. 25 N., R. 46 E.

Chains.

- A juniper, 4 ins. in diam., bears S. 16° E., 52 lks. distant, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT
- A pinon pine, 5 ins. in diam., bears S. 14° W., 58 lks. distant, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S3 BT
- Desc. NE. slope 40 ft.
- .42.80 Dry wash, drains NW.
- 45.70 Dry wash, drains W. Asc. S. slope 170 ft.
- 56.20 Top of spur, projects W. Desc. N. slope 20 ft.
- 58.20 Dry wash, drains N. 60° W.
- 63.80 Top of spur, projects NW. Desc. N. slope 100 ft.
- 69.30 Dry wash, drains NW. Asc. S. slope 20 ft.
- 75.30 Top of spur, projects NW. Desc. N. slope 130 ft.
- 83.70 Dry wash, drains W. Asc. 65 ft.
- 89.83 Intersect the Fifth Standard Parallel North, at a point, East, 5.60 chs. distant, from the Standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., of sec. 34, which is an iron post, 1 in. in diam., firmly set, and properly marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 26 N., R. 46 E.
- At point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3, with brass cap mkd.

- A juniper, 10 ins. in diam., bears S. $20\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 41 lks. distant, marked CC T25N R46E S2 BT
- A pinon pine, 5 ins. in diam., bears S. $18\text{-}3/4^{\circ}$ W., 14 lks. distant, marked CC T25N R46E S3 BT
- Land, broken mountainous. Soil, rocky and gravelly clay. Undergrowth, sage; scant growth of grass. Timber, pinon pine and juniper.

From the cor. of secs. 33 and 34, on the S. Bdy. of the township,

N. $0^{\circ} 02'$ W., bet. secs. 33 and 34.
