

Survey of the subdivisions of T. 47 N., R. 33 E.

Chains.

Undergrowth, medium growth of sage, scant growth of grass and clumps of mountain laurel on higher slopes. Scattering clumps of aspen and willows along washes.

S. 89° 51' E., on a random line, bet. secs. 1 and 12.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.70 Fall 7 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 1 and 12 on the E.

Bdy. of the township, which is an iron post, 2 ins.

in diam., firmly set and properly marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 47 N., R. 34 E.

Thence

(N. 89° 54' W., on a true line, bet. secs. 1 and 12.

Asc. rocky NE. slope 600 ft. over rough mountainous land.

39.85 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 14 ins.

Land, rough, broken and mountainous. Soil, rocky, gravelly clay; very shallow. Undergrowth, scattering sage, mountain laurel and scant growth of grass.

109.33 Fall 48 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 1 and 2.
