## General Description, T. 47 N., R. 34 E.

The main divide between Kings River and Quinn River traverses the township in a northwesterly and southeasterly direction through sections 7, 8, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 29, 32 and 33.

The land lying to the east of the divide is, generally, a high, rolling mesa cut by rocky canyons in the eastern portion of the township. The approximate elevation of this portion of the township is 6500 feet. The land lying to the west of the divide is, generally, rough, broken and mountainous. The approximate elevation of this portion of the township ranges from 5000 feet to 7000 feet.

The soil of the higher land is a light, sandy, rocky and gravelly clay. The soil along the creeks, ravines and washes is a rich black loam, six inches to eighteen inches in depth, over a light, rocky clay subsoil. The table lands and higher slopes within the township are covered with a scattering to medium growth of
