General Description

The greater part of the township is located in chains of low lying mountains, ranging from gently rolling in the southeast portion to rough mountainous in the west range of sections.

There is a medium stand of timber in all except the two east range of sections, the predominanting types are juniper, pinon, and mountain mahogany.

Sagebrush to a good height covers the entire township, there being also scattering stands of buck brush, choke cheery, and manzanita.

Considerable development work has been done in sections 29 and 32, but enough mineral has not been found to make mining profitable.

There are several good springs and the township is unsuited to any kind of profitable pursuit, except stockraising.
