

Survey of the E. boundary T. 28 N., R. 53 E.

Chains

I begin at the cor. of Ts. 27 and 28 N., Rs. 53 and 54 E., which is described "Book C", under Group No. 111, containing the field notes of T. 27 N., R. 53 E., the survey of which was executed in conjunction with the survey of this township

Thence

North, on a random line setting temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. and sec. cors. at regular intervals, and at

478.92 Intersect the N. bdy. of T. 28 N., R. 54 E., 3.13 chs. E. of the cor. of Ts. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 53 and 54 E., which is a 3 in. iron post, firmly set in the ground, properly marked and witnessed as described in the original survey of T. 29 N., R. 54 E. I remark cor. to read as follows:
