General Description.

With the exception of sections 6, 7, 30 and 31, the
 entire township is located in rough mountains, portions
 of it being rugged to precipitous in nature. The summit
 of the range traverses the township in a northwesterly
 and southeasterly direction through sections 3, 10, 11,
 14, 23, 25, 26 and 36. The slopes in the higher
 elevations are broken by numerous ledges and rock
 slides.

In those portions adjacent to the top of the range, heavy
 stands of pinon, juniper, and mountain mahogany are
