General description of T. 23 N., R. 46 E.

The western portion of this township is mountainous land descending to slightly rolling land in the eastern portion. The soil of the higher land is a rocky, gravelly clay of medium texture, and that of the lower land is a sandy, gravelly clay containing some rock. The entire western and central portion of the township is covered with a scattering to medium growth of juniper. The higher land within the township is covered with sage and a good growth of grass, the lower portion being covered with a medium growth of shadscale, with some sage along the bottom of washes, and with a scant growth of grass.

There is a narrow meadow of native grass along Cowboy Rest Creek in secs. 21, 29 and 30, containing, approximately 50 acres. This land can be irrigated to some extent from the small flow of water in Cowboy Rest Creek. There is also a small meadow of native grass in sec. 19, containing approximately 20 acres. The remaining portion of the township is suitable, chiefly, as grazing land.

There is a small stream of running water in Rosebush Creek, in sec. 31 and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$; NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 32, throughout the year; a small stream of running water in Cowboy Rest creek, in sec. 30 and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 29, throughout the year; running water in sec. 9 and the west half of sec. 10 from springs heading in the eastern portion of sec. 8.
