

Subdivision of T. 23 N., R. 49 E.

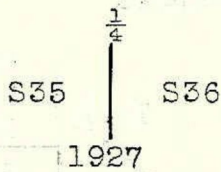
Chains

At base of monument, deposit a granite stone, 7x6x6 ins., marked with a cross (X).  
Corner situated on gentle SE. slope, 1 ch. S. of low rise, bears NE. and SW.  
Land, rolling mountainous with general NW. and N. exposure and drainage into Antelope Creek.  
Soil, gravelly clay, mixed with some scattered rock, lying on cemented gravel and clay subsoil; 3rd rate.  
Undergrowth, dense sagebrush, scattered service brush.  
No timber.

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From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36 on S. bdy. of tp., hereinbefore described.  
N. 0°01' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.  
Over rolling mountainous land, through scattered timber and dense undergrowth; asc. steep S. slope, 70 ft.  
5.10 Ridge, bears N.60°E., and W.; a saddle bears N.60°E. about 5 chs. dist.; desc. NE. slope, 125 ft.  
16.00 Small draw, drains N.20°W.; thence along a gradual W. slopes, descending.  
25.80 Begin descent over N. slope into draw.  
30.50 Draw, 255 ft. below ridge, drains W. for 8 chs., thence N.30°W.; ascend S. slope, entering dense timber, bears E. and W.  
36.00 Top of steep ascent from draw, slope changes to gradual SW. and W.  
40.00 On a gradual W. slope, 125 ft. above draw,  
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 10 ins. in the ground to rock, and supported by a mound of stone, for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

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from which
