GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF T. 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 49 E.

The lands embraced within this fractional township is mainly rolling mountainous or rolling. The eastern portion has a general northeasterly and northerly exposure and drainage into Tonkin Creek, which drains towards Denay Valley. The central portion comprising of the major portions of secs. 4 and 5, has a southerly exposure and drainage towards Coils Creek; and and western portion faces N. to NW. and drains into Antelope Creek. The eastern part of township is covered with a scattering growth of scrub cedar and pinon pine timber, while the west portion is nearly void of timber. Dense black sagebrush from 1 to 3 ft. high is found throughout the township.

The soil is principally a dry, firm gravelly to gravelly clay, lying on subsoil of cemented gravel or stiff clay,
