Chains.

rocky clay. Undergrowth, sage and scattering buck brush;
fair growth of grass. No timber.

Retracement of a portion of the subdivisions of
T24N., R. 49 E.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the S. Bdy. of
the township, hereinbefore described,

North, on retracement, bet. secs. 34 and 35.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. No trace of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
could be found.

80.00 Fall 16 lks. W. of the old cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and
35, which is a hewn juniper post, partially decayed and
lying on an old mound of earth, marked S26 on NE. face.
The course of this mile is N. $0^{\circ} 07'$ E. and the distance
is 80.00 chs.

North, on retracement, bet. secs. 26 and 27.

40.00 No trace of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. could be found; Set temp.
point.

80.00 Fall 28 lks. W. of the old cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and
27, which is a partially decayed juniper post, found
lying on an old mound of earth, marked T24N R49E S23 on
one face; S26 on one face; S27 on one face and S22 on
one face, from which a juniper, 6 ins. in diam., bears
S. $70\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 94 lks. distant.

The course of this mile is N. $0^{\circ} 12'$ E. and the distance
is 80.00 chs.

North, on retracement, bet. secs. 22 and 23.

39.53 Fall 78 lks. W. of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is a
porphyry stone, 16 x 5 x 3 ins., firmly set, marked $\frac{1}{4}$
on N. face. From which a juniper, 20 ins. in diam.,
bears N. 78° E., 43 lks. distant, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ BT: a juniper,
15 ins. in diam., bears S. 87° W., 56 lks. distant,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ BT
