General description of T. 24 N., R. 49 E.

The main divide between Demale and Antelope creeks traverses the township in a northerly and southerly direction through the western portion of the township. The land along the divide is rolling and broken mountainous, descending abruptly on the east slope to slightly rolling land and on the west slope to rolling mountainous land. That portion of the township east of the divide is generally heavily timbered, pinon pine predominating in the southeast portion with a secondary growth of juniper and juniper predominating generally in the northeast portion of the township. From the center of section 29, north along the divide, to the line between sections 7 and 18, the land is covered with a dense growth of magohany, pinon pine and juniper, which extends from 20.00 to 30.00 chains down the west slope. Except sections 19 and 30, where there is a heavy growth of pinon pine and juniper, the western portion of the township is covered with scattering juniper and pinon pine.

There is a medium growth of sage over the entire township and scattering buck brush in the western portion. The entire area is covered with a fair growth of grass and affords excellent grazing, for which the land is chiefly valuable.
