43.70	Draw, 10 ft. below spur, drains W.; ascend S. slope.
47.30	Spur, 55 ft. above draw, projects W.; descend along W. slope.
53.25	Head of draw, 5 ft. below spur, drains W. about 5 chs., thence S.; ascend S. slope.
56.20	Spur, 45 ft. above draw, projects SE. about 5 chs., thence SE.; descend N. slope.
62.90	Draw, 45 ft. below spur, drains SE.; ascend S. slope.
69.30	Spur, 60 ft. above draw, projects SE.; descend N. slope.
73.00	Head of draw, 15 ft. below spur, drains S. 80°E., about 8 chs. to junction with draw from N., thence S.; ascend
81.02	The reconstructed cor. of Ts. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 47 and 48 E., for description of which see the field notes of dependent resurvey of T. 38 N., R. 48 E., this group.
	Land, rolling mountains; S. exposure.

	N. 0° 30' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.
	Descend gentle N. slope over rolling land, through medium dense undergrowth.
16.45	Draw, 70 ft. below sec. cor., drains NW.; ascend S. slope.
23.00	Low ridge, 75 ft. above draw, brs. NW. and SE.; descend N. slope.
