- 30.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground for 1/2 sec. cor., with brass cap marked
  - 34.00 S 1 S 6
  - 38.00 Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high W. of
  - 46.20 Spur, 30 ft. above 1/2 sec. cor., projects W.; descend.
  - 56.75 Draw, 90 ft. below spur, drains SW. about 1 ch., thence NW.; ascend S. slope.
  - 60.50 Spur, .60 ft. above draw, projects W.; descend N. slope.
  - 68.00 Draw, 45 ft. below spur, drains W.; ascend
  - 72.40 Spur, 40 ft. above draw, projects W.; descend.
  - 78.18 The cor. of Ts. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 47 and 48 E., for description of which see the field notes of resurvey of T. 39 N., R. 48 E., this Group.
- Land, rolling mountains; W. drainage and exposure.
- Soil, heavy clay loam; gravelly and rocky; 3rd rate.

- Undergrowth, medium growth of sagebrush from 2 to 4 ft. high; medium growth of grass.
- Good grazing land.
