

Metes and bounds survey of lots 3, 4, and 5, of sec. 5, T. 35 N., R. 18 E.

Chains Tract segregations of lots 3, 4 and 5, of sec. 5, T. 35N., R. 18 E. were made necessary by reason of existing irregularities between the Garside and the Benson and Putnam surveys, and the obliteration or absence of all physical evidence on the ground of the Garside surveys. These lots were located with reference to the tie from the original Garside closing corner of Ts. 35 and 36 N., R. 18 E., to the 72nd mile post on the Nevada-California State Line. Mr. Edward P. Waltz, representative of the Gerlach Live Stock Co., claimants, was consulted when these claims were surveyed. Acceptable locations with reference to the Garside tie to the 72nd mile corner on the Nevada-California boundary line, and also with reference to existent subdivision corners in T. 35N., R. 18E., were pointed out on the ground, but were not acceptable to the Gerlach Live Stock Co. Mr. Waltz was advised to inform the Gerlach Live Stock Co. of the results of the segregation so that if a protest were to be made, it could be so done in writing. Nothing has been heard from the claimants to date.
