

General description of fractional T. 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 18 E.

Chains.

This fractional township is situated on a high mesa at the extreme south end of Duck Flat, approximately ten miles south of the main Gerlach and Cedarville road. The land in the west half of section 33; east half of section 32 and the central portion of section 36 along the canyon is broken and mountainous with numerous outcroppings and ledges of volcanic origin. The remaining portion of the township is rolling mountainous.

The soil of the township is a heavy clay or adobe, very rocky, and generally thickly strewn with surface rock of volcanic origin.

The undergrowth consists of a medium growth of sage, and a scattering to medium growth of buckbrush and deer browse and affords excellent grazing for which the land is wholly suited.

There is a scattering to medium growth of juniper, scattering growth of pinon pine and dense clumps of mahogany on crest of some of the spurs and ridges on the higher land.

The only water within the area surveyed is a seasonal flow in a canyon in section 36 of the township. A number of small spring on the surrounding area afford sufficient water for grazing purposes.

No mineral indications were observed within the township and there were no settlers residing within the township at the time of this survey.

The township is not accessible except by pack trains from roads leading into the south end of Duck Flat.
