

## Survey of the Stonehouse Lode.

Chains. At the original location monument for the NW. cor. of the Stonehouse lode, identical with the SW. location monument of the Usona No. 6 lode, which is a post, 4 ins. square, set in a mound of stone, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, in a mound of stone, for cor. No. 1 of the Stonehouse lode and cor. No. 5 of the Usona No. 6 lode, with brass cap mkd.

from which the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 30 and 31, which is an iron post, 1 in. in diam., firmly set and properly marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 33 N., R. 37 E., bears N. 15° 08' E., 17.79 chs. dist.

S. 76° 50' E.

Desc. along gentle, rocky W. slope.

5.30 Dry wash, course SW. Asc. gradually.

9.22 Intersect the NE. location cor. of the Stonehouse lode, identical with the SE. location cor. of the Usona No. 6 lode, which is a post, 4 ins. square. At point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for cor. No. 2 of the Stonehouse lode and Cor. No. 4 of the Usona No. 6 lode, with brass cap mkd.
