	From the cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., Rs. 55 and 56 E. on the Ruby Valley Guide Meridian, heretofore described.
	West, bet. secs. 1 and 36.
40.00	No trace of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. can be found. I therefore continue my line west making searches at intervals of 40.00 chs. for sec. and $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cors. but none can be found; at
490.14	Intersect E. bdy. of T.4 N., R.54 E., 10.39 chs. S. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. E. bdy. sec. 1. No trace of the original closing cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., R.55 E. can be found. The restored position of this closing cor. therefore is 9.68 chs., S.0° 02' W., of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. E. bdy. sec. 1. For description of cor. see resurvey S. bdy. sec. 31, T. 5 N., R.55 E. hereinafter recorded.
	The bearing of the N. bdy. of T.4 N., R.55 E. therefore is N.89°55' W. One set of cors. will be established at proportional distances of 40.51 chs. for T. 5 N., and another set at intervals of 40.00 chs. for T.4 N., counting from the cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., Rs. 55 and 56 E. as follows:

	From the cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., Rs. 55 and 56 E., N.89°55' W., along N. bdy. sec. 1, T.4 N., R.55 E. Over rolling land sloping N., through short undergrowth.
7.20	Old road, bears N.10° E., and S.10° W.; ditch, 3 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, course N.20° W. about 5 chs. to reservoir.
11.85	Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains N.
18.30	Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains N.
40.00	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in
