Chains	SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T.4 N., R.55 E.
	From the cor. of Tps. 3 and 4 N., Rs. 55 and 56 E., on the Ruby Valley Guide Meridian, heretofore described. West, on true line bet. secs. 1 and 36.
	Descend W. slope over high, rough mountainous land through dense timber and medium undergrowth.
3.60	Bottom of Big Creek Canyon, about 4 chs. wide, and stream of clear mountain water, 3 lks. wide, 4 ins. deep, 85 ft. below Tp. cor., course N. Scattered large yellow pine and cottonwood timber along creek. Water at this season of the year (August) flows about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile down canyon and sinks.
	Ascend steep E. slope through dense timber.
11.20	Spur, 205 ft. above canyon, projects N.30°E.; gradually descend NW. slope.
19.00	Small draw, near head, drains N.30°E.; ascend steep E. slope.
27.80	Spur, 545 ft. above canyon, projects N.30°E.; descend NW. slope.
34.50	Draw, 160 ft. below spur, drains NE.; ascend E. slope.
40.00	On steep E. slope, 180 ft. above draw.
	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
	$\frac{1}{4}$ — <u>S36</u> ✓ S1 1929
	From which
	A pinon, 8 ins. diam., bears N.86°45'E., 68 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T A pinon, 7 ins. diam., bears S.70°E., 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T
	Continue ascent.
42.00	Low spur, 45 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., projects NE. about 15 chs. to end; thence along N. slope.
44.30	Cross head of small draw, drains NE.; ascend abruptly.
58.00	Base of broken granite ledges facing E., bears N. and S.
