

Retracement of the E. Bdy. of T. 13 N., R. 61 E.

Chains.

From the old cor. of Ts. 12 and 13 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., which is a decayed Juniper post, with scribe marks faintly discernible, lying alongside of cement building block, 16 x 12 x 8 ins. above ground. Evidence of old mound of earth at corner point.

North, on retracement, along the E. Bdy. of T. 13 N., R. 61 E., setting temporary points at 40.00 and 80.00 chs. and making diligent search for old corners. No old corners were found until a point

483.72 Fall 140 lks. W. of the old cor. of Ts. 13 and 14 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., which is a pine post, 2 ft. long, 4 ins. in diam., with all markings obliterated, lying in a mound of earth.

The course of this line is N. $0^{\circ} 10'$ E., and the proportionate length of each mile is 80.62 chs.

Dependent Resurvey of the E. Bdy. of T. 13 N., R. 61 E.

Alongside the old cor. of Ts. 12 and 13 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., hereinbefore described, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of Ts. 12 and 13 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., with brass cap mkd.
